Dr. Gomberg-Maitland is an expert clinician and researcher in the field of pulmonary vascular disease. She has been involved in over 10 clinical trials (single and multi-center) investigating new therapies and diagnostics for pulmonary hypertension. She has a strong interest in clinical trial design and analysis. She initiated an ongoing biobank and clinical repository to study the genetics of pulmonary hypertension and biomarker development. With her recently awarded Doris Duke Charitable Foundation Clinical Scientist Development Award, “Novel therapeutics in Pulmonary Hypertension”, she will begin early drug development trials.

Dr. Gomberg-Maitland’s clinical interests include the epidemiology and clinical care of pulmonary hypertension, drug development (Phase I/Phase II trials), congestive heart failure, acute coronary syndromes, atrial fibrillation, and women’s health.
